

At our center, we prioritize comfort and support as we provide a safe place for children who have alleged sexual or physical abuse to tell their story. We work closely with other involved departments and entities to seek compassion, healing, and justice - all in the best interest of the child.





Child & Family Advocacy

Our advocates work closely with the child clients and their non-offending family members to offer help, support, guidance, and comfort as they navigate the process of alleging, disclosing, prosecuting, and overcoming abuse.





Our specially trained forensic interviewers partner with multi-disciplinary team members from law enforcement, child protection, and state's attorneys to conduct proper interviews to determine what the child has endured and to be used in the investigation process.

Prevention Education



Empowering children through prevention education is at the core of our mission. We offer prevention education programs to all schools within our coverage area to help students of all ages identify, interrupt, and/or prevent all types of abuse including sexual, physical, verbal, emotional, and neglect.



A <u>Child Advocacy Center</u> provides a child-focused, trauma-informed, and multi-disciplinary team approach to child abuse investigations. Our center offers a child-friendly, safe location for children to receive a forensic interview following the report of alleged abuse.

We support children and their nonoffending family members through the disclosure process and provide services in order to promote healing for child sexual abuse victims and child physical abuse victims, as well as children who have witnessed violent trauma such as homicides or domestic violence.

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AMY'S STORY



Our center is named after Amy Schulz. When Amy was just 10-years-old, she was abducted, sexually assaulted, and murdered. Amy was a beautiful, spunky, and innocent child who was out for a walk down the lane to call her puppy in for dinner. Upon her death, her father, Dennis, was devastated to learn how many other parents were affected by similar tragedies. Through his fortitude, he founded The Amy Schulz Child Advocacy Center in 1990 to ensure resources were available to children who were able to survive abuse and deserved healing.



In addition to our advocacy, victim-sensitive interviews, and prevention education services, we operate a comfort closet that provides each child that walks through our doors with a bag full of hygiene items, blankets/quilts, books, toys, etc.

We hope to provide hope, healing, and comfort to child victims throughout Southern Illinois in Amy's memory. Her legacy lives on through the hundreds of children served each year at The Amy Center.
